

Arthur Rivett

Arthur started in nature conservation in 1979 as a volunteer with the Suffolk Wildlife Trust and in 1981 was appointed voluntary warden for the Norah Hanbury-Kelk Memorial Meadows, a new Suffolk Wildlife Trust nature reserve in Barton Mills, West Suffolk. In 1983 he was appointed full time North Suffolk Field Officer with the Suffolk Wildlife Trust, responsible for the management of Redgrave & Lopham Fen and others in the upper Waveney/Little Ouse valley. A position which he held for the next 15 years. He has been involved in the running of the Suffolk Bat Group since he helped set it up in 1984 and also the Suffolk Badger Group (now the Suffolk Mammal Group). He has been actively involved with the Little Ouse Headwaters Project from the start as a volunteer photographer and helped set up the photography group. More recently he has been involved in setting up the LOHP Mammal Recording Group.
